

Subject: UPDATE: The Leadership of the California Infrastructure Bank Moves the National

Needle

An update on a topic I haven't sent around a note on in a while . . . - be in touch if want to know more as advise in this area right now -

The California Infrastructure Bank (I-Bank) recently issued a \$400 million plus Green Bond. The proceeds are going to much needed water projects in the state. Given the dire situation caused by the drought, money is being deployed swiftly.

Another Green Bond issuance, perhaps more, is in the works. Green Bonds are increasingly used by governments and companies to invest in forward-looking energy projects. Apple recently issued a \$1.5 billion dollar one.

The I-Bank is the only multi-sector infrastructure bank in the country and has lent out well north of \$37 billion to-date. It was created by Republican Governor Pete Wilson and is now moving aggressively into Clean Energy under Governor Jerry Brown right now.

I co-chaired the Governor Edmund Brown Jr. Task Force to Modernize the California Infrastructure Bank. After an extensive period of analyzing its lending practices to-date and its statute, as well as conducting broad outreach to key stakeholders including a roadshow to leading Northeastern investors, we made a number of recommendations.

These recommendations have largely been take up. They included:

- 1) Moving the I-Bank from the Treasurer's Office to the Governor's Office so that it could be intimately linked into the Office and its priorities
- 2) Giving it a mandate to carry out Green Infrastructure
- 3) Using its powers to catalyze large scale private investment in public infrastructure
- 4) Increasing its senior level staff so that it had the expertise and breadth of capabilities to carry out a broader intensive set of responsibilities

These recommendations were adopted by the Governor with the first one actually making its way through an unruly deeply divided CA legislature.

The leadership of the I-Bank is doing important innovative leading things right now within the Clean Endrgy and public-private partnership space right now. Nationally important innovative leading.

The issuance of the Green Bond is only the first part of planned program of clean energy infrastructure projects.

The I-Bank established what is called the California Lending for Energy and Environmental Needs Center, what it refers to for short as the CLEEN Center.

The CLEEN Center has broad powers to make clean energy projects happen including through the issuance of Green Bonds, use of loans, loan guarantees, and public-private partnerships catalyzed through credits, insurance and other enhancements.

In a time in which federal support for clean projects is in jeopardy, being rolled back in places or simply not up to the task of funding much needed projects, the I-Bank now has a directive to finance a range of project types including:

- 1. Renewable Energy
- 2. Storage Technology
- 3. Water
- 4. Alternative Technologies
- 5. Hydrogen Production
- 6. Alternative Fuels
- 7. Transportation
- 8. Energy Efficiency
- 9. Industrial Process Efficiency
- 10. Residential

In the current presidential cycle both the Secretary of State and Mr. Trump have made infrastructure investments a cornerstone of their respective economic platforms.

Recently, we at 32 Advisors held an event, hosted by Shearman & Sterling, on the election and infrastructure investments.

We had a lively discussion about how these commitments might make their way in practice. Happy to share what came out at the event. What is happening in California with the I-Bank warrants a careful review by each of the candidates; it will be of great interest in CA and beyond.





I moved from Vancouver BC to live in Israel, that suffers more terror, year after year, than any other democratic, 1st world country.

The former Mayor of Miami Beach, David Dermer, can also serve as a reference.





Orlando Shootings, Radical Jihadism and the Terrorism Terminology Battles

The <u>terrorism terminology battle</u> that has simmered for years and most recently flared between <u>Donald</u>

<u>Trump</u> on one side and <u>Hillary Clinton</u> and <u>Barack Obama</u> on the other boils down to this: Is there value or utility in linking and identifying as Islamic (radical or extremist) the spate of terror attacks carried out by those

who identify with Islamic State or other jihadi causes? No one argues for anything that would make more difficult the fight against those extremists who draw on Islamic texts and practices, however perversely, to validate their killing. A distinction is whether word choice or actions would alienate Muslim constituencies here and abroad that many–including me–would argue are vital to that fight.

President Obama, Mr. Trump, and Mrs. Clinton have made multiple statements and speeches since New Yorkborn Omar Mateen <u>killed 49 people and injured more than 50 others in Orlando</u>. Mr. Trump denounced the shootings as "radical Islamic terrorism" and charged that the president is not only weak on such issues but also that failing to identify the problem makes eliminating it impossible. President Obama has said that "<u>If we fall</u> into the trap of painting all Muslims with a broad brush and imply that we are at war with an entire religion, then we are doing the terrorists' work for them."

Mrs. Clinton, under pressure, has said both that "I'm not going to demonize and demagogue and declare war on an entire religion. That's just plain dangerous and it plays into ISIS's hands." as well as that "Radical jihadism, radical Islamism, I think they mean the same thing. I'm happy to say either."

The Obama administration is in many ways following the George W. Bush administration's lead. After Sept. 11, 2001, President Bush avoided declaring war on Islam or the Muslim world. During a visit to the Islamic Center in Washington less than a week after 9/11, Mr. Bush said: "The face of terror is not the true faith of Islam. That's not what Islam is all about. Islam is peace." Just days later, Mr. Bush's use of the loaded word "crusade"—"This crusade, this war on terrorism, is going to take a while."—sparked controversy, but by and large his administration described terrorism as acts of evil, which avoided fostering the idea that the U.S. was at war with Islam and sought to minimize the backlash against Muslims in the U.S. A "war on terror" was deemed more appropriate.

The Obama White House dubbed its summit on counterterrorism a meeting to counter violent extremism, itself steering clear of specific labels to help strengthen relations with Muslims in the U.S. and to avoid offending Muslims abroad who are allies in the fight against terrorism.

Mr. Trump's references to banning Muslims and accusing Muslims in the U.S. of supporting terrorists strike many–including me—as bigoted, xenophobic, and Islamophobic. At the same time, the Obama administration's apparent reluctance to consistently associate such attacks with jihadi extremism angers many. There is no point in denying connections between acts of terrorism and Islamist extremists. Of the five terror groups responsible for the most attacks worldwide, three promote an extreme Islamist ideology, according to the State

Department's 2015 counterterrorism report. The Orlando shooter's 9-1-1 calls, reports of what he said in the Pulse nightclub, and his previous associations with jihadi rhetoric suggest that he was inspired to some extent by the ISIS narrative. Accurately describing the challenge presented by jihadi attacks helps to clarify the complex task ahead. This isn't a clash of civilizations, nor is the U.S. at war with 1.7 billion Muslims or a religion in which a tiny fraction who adhere to extremist strains kill and inspire others to do so. Still, no other major religion is linked to such a phenomenon. Jihadi terror isn't an existential threat to the United States. But it is capable of inflicting tremendous suffering, and inadvertently minimizing this kind of terrorism doesn't help.

In our polarized political climate, consensus on language or a unifying message isn't forthcoming, particularly not in a presidential-election year. Still, nearly 15 years after 9/11 inflicted a tragic unifying moment, more ought to be possible in terms of accurately describing these adversaries and, more important, what to do about them.





First, my thoughts and prayers go out to the victims of the Pulse nightclub shooting and their families, and to you and your constituents. These types of events not only affect the victims and their immediate families, but society at large: they remind us of our vulnerability and the senselessness of mass violence.

Me and two other researchers have developed a predictive analytics strategy that we think could substantially assist law enforcement in getting early warning for a potential mass shooting. This strategy proposes tracking ammunition purchases in a secure, centralized database. The purchases are anonymized to protect identity, but with the ability to get a purchasers' ID after due process.

The ammunition purchase database will allow law enforcement to leverage powerful big data technology and predictive analytics to identify unusual ammunition purchase patterns that are indicative of an impending mass shooting. In addition, the system can learn over time by training it with actual shooting events and the ammunition purchase behavior that preceded it.

I have attached a more detailed description if you would like to know more. Of course, I and my fellow researchers are available to you as well, should you wish to discuss further.



Refugees come to the United States from some of the most hard-hit corners all around the world, having experienced hardships that the rest of us can barely imagine. Refugees are admitted to the United States for seeking a safe haven from a well-founded fear of persecution in their home countries, but they arrive to contribute to the American economy in a myriad of ways: bringing vitality to areas with declining populations, contributing to the growth of areas that are already flourishing, and expanding the labor force.

This <u>report</u> focuses on how four groups—Somali, Burmese, Hmong, and Bosnian refugees— are doing on key indicators of integration, such as wages, labor market participation, business ownership, English language ability, and citizenship in the United States. As the United States and other countries wrestle with how to handle the sharp rise in the number of people around the globe displaced by conflict and persecution, the long-term experience of the four groups studied in this report should provide some grounds for encouragement.





On Thursday, Lynx unveiled a new bus wrap to commemorate the victims of the Pulse nightclub mass shooting in Orlando.

"We touch just about every aspect of this community, and we needed to show our support," said Lynx CEO Edward Johnson. "We wanted to come up with a way to show that we stand as part of the OneOrlando mindset."

The bus features Orlando's Lake Eola fountain surrounded by a heart, a pulse and 49 doves representing the 49 victims of the tragedy.

"We tried to think of a way not only to honor the victims, but also to bring Orlando together," said lead creative designer Jessica Casa. "It seemed like the perfect thing to have [the fountain] in the heart and have a pulse entering it — the pulse of the city of Orlando."

The bus wrap was produced rapidly. Once the design team began, it was only a matter of hours until they put the finishing touches on the final product. After that, the installation company stepped in. Although the print and installation process typically takes three to four days, employees worked through the night to get the bus ready as quickly as possible.

"We're all very proud of the final product," Johnson said.

Although the bus is not running any routes yet, Johnson hopes it will run along Orange Avenue as a tribute to where the shooting took place.

The bus will remain in the fleet for some time to come.

"We don't want to put any timetable on this because we know that this event is going to be with us for a while," said Johnson. "There are a lot of things we have to go through as far as the healing process."

The company's Boston-based advertising contractor, Direct Media USA, is donating a second commemorative bus due to arrive in the upcoming week.

"They understand OneOrlando [because] they understand Boston Strong," said Matthew Friedman, director of marketing communications for Lynx.

"My hope for this design is that it will help the community heal," Casa said. "It's a tough time, and we want people to know we're all in this together."

Lynx has also started an internal company website to collect money that will be donated to the OneOrlando fund.

"This was such a small token of what we could do to show our spirit as well as get the message out to our entire community: We are a unified Orlando," Johnson said.



Orlando, **FL** - The Salvation Army disaster response teams from the Orlando and Sanford corps continue to provide support to first responders and families at The Pulse nightclub, providing food, drinks, and emotional and spiritual care.

"Yesterday was a day of transition as we worked with the local, state, and federal teams to ensure the safety of the personnel on the ground," said Major Ted Morris, Salvation Army Orlando Area Commander. "With the heat index reaching into triple digits yesterday, people need to stay hydrated. Heat

exhaustion is a serious concern."

Providing food and drinks is a core service of The Salvation Army, and while food service will continue, the more critical need is hydration. In addition to its mobile canteens, The Salvation Army has also mobilized three Polaris utility task vehicles (UTVs) to more effectively distribute water and sports drinks to responder personnel throughout the secure area. With streets blocked off to traffic, the Polaris UTVs have allowed teams to get resources to responders more efficiently, ensuring the safety of more than three hundred local, state, and federal personnel.

Major Ted Morris and Mr. Kelvin Coachman, Salvation Army Director of Social Services, are also coordinating with other community organizations to support families at the City of Orlando 'one-stop' assistance center, located at Camping World stadium. The Salvation Army has positioned a second disaster response team at the stadium to provide hydration and snacks to family members seeking information and assistance.

"In the Central Florida community, we support needy families every day, and in the days to come, we need to focus on finding resources for all those coping with this tragedy," said Major Morris. "Comfort may come in the forms of either financial assistance or physical aid, like hydration and snacks, but we also know that many of these families need to know that we care deeply and we grieve with them in their loss."



Out of Africa SCIENCE

Somewhere between 80,000 and 50,000 years ago, Africa saved *Homo sapiens* from extinction. Charting the DNA shared by more than <u>six billion people</u>, a population geneticist—and director of the Genographic Project—suggests what humanity "owes" its first home. Do you think you know who you are? Maybe Irish, Italian, Jewish, Chinese, or one of the dozens of other hyphenated Americans that make up the United States melting pot? Think deeper—beyond the past few hundred years. Back beyond genealogy, where everyone loses track of his or her ancestry—back in that dark, mysterious realm we call prehistory. What if I told you every single person in America—every single person on earth—is African? With a small scrape of cells from the inside of anyone's cheek, the science of genetics can even prove it.

Here's how it works. The human genome, the blueprint that describes how to make another version of you, is huge. It's composed of billions of sub-units called nucleotides, repeated in a long, linear code that contains all of your biological information. Skin color, hair type, the way you metabolize milk: it's all in there. You got your DNA from your parents, who got it from theirs, and so on, for millions of generations to the very beginning of life on earth. If you go far enough back, your genome connects you with bacteria, butterflies, and barracuda—the great chain of being linked together through DNA.

What about humanity, though? What about creatures you would recognize as being like you if they were peering over your shoulder right now? It turns out that every person alive today can trace his or her ancestry back to Africa. Everyone's DNA tells a story of a journey from an African homeland to wherever you live. You may be from Cambodia or County Cork but you are carrying a map inside your genome that describes the wanderings of your ancestors as they moved from the savannas of Africa to wherever your family came from most recently. This is thanks to genetic markers—tiny changes that arise rarely and spontaneously as our DNA is copied and passed down through the generations—which serve to unite people on ever older branches of the human family tree. If you share a marker with someone, you share an ancestor with him or her at some point in the past: the person who's DNA first had the marker that defines your shared lineage. These markers can be traced to relatively specific times and places as humans moved across the globe. The farther back in time and the closer to Africa we get, the more markers we all share.

What set these migrations in motion? Climate change—today's big threat—seems to have had a long history of tormenting our species. Around 70,000 years ago it was getting very nippy in the northern part of the globe, with ice sheets bearing down on Seattle and New York; this was the last Ice Age. At that time, though, our species, *Homo sapiens*, was still limited to Africa; we were very much homebodies. But the encroaching Ice Age, perhaps coupled with the eruption of a super-volcano named Toba, in Sumatra, dried out the tropics and nearly decimated the early human population. While *Homo sapiens* can be traced to around 200,000 years ago in the fossil record, it is remarkably difficult to find an archaeological record of our species between 80,000 and 50,000 years ago, and genetic data suggest that the

population eventually dwindled to as few as 2,000 individuals. Yes, 2,000—fewer than fit into many symphony halls. We were on the brink of extinction.

And then something happened. It began slowly, with only a few hints of the explosion to come: The first stirrings were art—tangible evidence of advanced, abstract thought—and a significant improvement in the types of tools humans made. Then, around 50,000 years ago, all hell broke loose. The human population began to expand, first in Africa, then leaving the homeland to spread into Eurasia. Within a couple of thousand years we had reached Australia, walking along the coast of South Asia. A slightly later wave of expansion into the Middle East, around 45,000 years ago, was aided by a brief damp period in the Sahara. Within 15,000 years of the exodus from Africa our species had entered Europe, defeating the Neanderthals in the process. (Neanderthals are distant cousins, not ancestors; our evolutionary lineages have been separate for more than 500,000 years.) We had also populated Asia, learning to live in frigid temperatures not unlike those on the Moon, and around 15,000 years ago we walked across a short-lived, icy land bridge to enter the Americas—the first hominids ever to set foot on the continents of the Western Hemisphere. Along the way we kept adapting to new climates, in some cases lost our dark tropical skin pigmentation, developed different languages, and generated the complex tapestry of human diversity we see around the world today, from Africa to Iceland to Tierra del Fuego. But the thing that set it all in motion, the thing that saved us from extinction, happened first in Africa.

Some anthropologists call it the Great Leap Forward, and it marked the true origin of our species—the time when we started to behave like humans.

Africa gave us the tool we needed, in the form of a powerful, abstract mind, to take on the world (and eventually to decode the markers in our DNA that make it possible to track our amazing journeys). Perhaps just a few small genetic mutations that appeared around 50,000 years ago gave humans the amazing minds we use to make sense of the confusing and challenging world around us. Using our incredible capacity to put abstract musing into practice, we have managed to populate every continent on earth, in the process increasing the size of our population from a paltry few thousand to more than six billion. Now, 50 millennia after that first spark, times have changed. A huge number of things have contributed to Africa's relative decline on the world stage, perhaps most important geography. As Jared Diamond describes in his masterly book *Guns, Germs, and Steel,* Eurasia, with its East-West axis, allowed the rapid latitudinal diffusion of ideas and tools that would give its populations a huge advantage after the initial leap out of Africa. Couple that with the results of colonial exploitation over the past five centuries, and Africa, despite many strengths and resources, is once again in need, as it was 70,000 years ago. This time, though, things are different.

The world population that was spawned in Africa now has the power to save it. We are all alive today because of what happened to a small group of hungry Africans around 50,000 years ago. As their good sons and daughters, those of us who left, whether long ago or more recently, surely have a moral imperative to use our gifts to support our cousins who stayed. It's the least we can do for the continent that saved us all thousands of years ago.

- Sura (chapter) 2:82: "But those who have faith and work righteousness, they are companions of the Garden: Therein shall they abide (For ever)."
- 3:133: "Be quick in the race for forgiveness from your Lord, and for a Garden whose width is that (of the whole) of the heavens and of the earth, prepared for the righteous."
- 3:185: "Every soul shall have a taste of death: And only on the Day of Judgment shall you be paid your full recompense. Only he who is saved far from the Fire and admitted to the Garden will have attained the object (of Life): For the life of this world is but goods and chattels of deception."
- 18:107: "As to those who believe and work righteous deeds, they have, for their entertainment, the Gardens of Paradise."
- 39:73: "And those who feared their Lord will be led to the Garden in crowds: until behold, they arrive there; its gates will be opened; and its keepers will say: 'Peace be upon you! well have ye done! enter ye here, to dwell therein'."
- 39:74: "They will say: 'Praise be to God, Who has truly fulfilled His Promise to us, and has given us (this) land in heritage: We can dwell in the Garden as we will: how excellent a reward for those who work (righteousness)!' "
- 47:15: "(Here is) a Parable of the Garden which the righteous are promised: in it are rivers of water incorruptible; rivers of milk of which the taste never changes; rivers of wine, a joy to those who drink; and rivers of honey pure and clear. In it there are for them all kinds of fruits; and Grace from their Lord...."
- Sura 56:1-40 of the Qur'an deals in depth with the Day of Judgment and the rewards that await persons who have led a good life.

- •56:15-21: "[They will sit] on gold-encrusted thrones of happiness, reclining upon them, facing one another in [love]. Immortal youths will wait upon them with goblets, and ewers, and cups filled with water from unsullied springs by which their minds will not be clouded and which will not make them drunk; and with fruit of any kind that they choose, and with flesh of any fowl that they may desire."
- •56:22-26: "And [accompanying them will be their] companions pure, most beautiful of eye, like unto pearls hidden in their shells. [This will be] a reward for what they did [during life]. No empty talk will they hear there, nor any call to sin, but only the tiding of inner soundness and peace."
- •56:27-33: "Now as for those who have attained to righteousness- what of those who have attained to righteousness? [They too will find themselves] amidst fruit-laden lote-trees, and acacias flower-clad, and shade extended, and waters gushing, and fruit abounding, never-failing and never out of reach."
- •56:34-37: "And [with them will be their] spouses, raised high; for behold, We shall have brought them into being in a life renewed, having resurrected them as virgins, full of love, well matched to those who have attained to righteousness"
- Surah 55 discusses the presence of "húr." They have most commonly been considered to be Houris -- beautiful virgins:
 - **55:70:** "In them will be fair [Maidens], good, beautiful."
 - •55:72: "Maidens restrained [as to their glances], in [goodly] pavilions."
 - 55:74: "Whom no man or Jinn before them has touched."

Janna (Paradise, Heaven) is called by eight names in the Qur'an: Jannatu al-Khuld, Darul as-Salam, Darul al-Qarar, Jannatu al-`Adn, Jannatu al-Ma`wa, Jannatu an-Na`im, `Illiyin, and Jannatu al-Firdaus. *Janna* is the Arabic word for "garden." 1 They have been translated into English as: paradise, a garden on high, a home that will last, garden of eternity, garden of everlasting bliss, gardens of delight, home of peace, home of the righteous, etc. 2

The Prophet Muhammad is quoted as saying that everyone will see God on the Day of Resurrection, as easily as one can see the sun when there are no clouds. 3

There will be no sickness, pain, sadness or death there. The Prophet Muhammad said that there are things in Paradise "which no eye has seen no ear has heard and no human mind has thought of." 4

Surah 44:51-55 and 52:17-20 state that the men in Paradise will enter marriage with the Houris.

<u>Jinns</u> are living entities that God created from "a smokeless flame of fire." ₅ They are invisible to the human eye but marry, produce children, eat, drink, and die like all other creatures in the universe." _{7,8}

In his commentary on Surah 55:72, Ibn Kathir (d. 1373 CE) stated: "The Prophet Muhammad was heard saying: 'The smallest reward for the people of paradise is an abode where there are 80,000 servants and 72 wives, over which stands a dome decorated with pearls, aquamarine, and ruby, as wide as the distance from Al-Jabiyyah [a Damascus suburb] to Sana'a [Yemen]'." 9

Who is eligible for entry into Paradise:

Entry to Paradise is limited to those who believe in God and his messengers, and who have led a good life on earth. In the Qur'an:

- **Surah 2:25:** "And give good news [O Muhammad] to those who believe and do good deeds, that they will have gardens [Paradise] in which rivers flow...."
- **Surah 4:57:** "But those who believe and do good deeds, We will admit them to gardens (Paradise) in which rivers flow, lasting in them forever...."
- **Surah 57:21:** "Race one with another for forgiveness from your Lord and for Paradise, whose width is as the width of the heavens and the earth, which has been prepared for those who believe in God and His messengers...."

Presumably Agnostics, Atheists, Polytheists, and followers of non-<u>Abrahamic religions</u> will be denied access to Paradise because they lack belief. NOW-- BACK TO SAVING OUR EARTH FROM DESTRUCTION.

Various studies to estimate the number of galaxies in the universe vary from 200 to 800 billion. The vastness of space is best appreciated when distance out there is described in light years.





The First Life on Earth

Earth was able to support life only after the planet had cooled enough for a rocky crust to solidify. Once that happened, water vapor from volcanoes condensed in the atmosphere, fell as rain, and collected on the Earth's surface. Besides water vapor, volcanoes also produced gases rich in the basic ingredients of life: carbon, hydrogen, oxygen, and nitrogen. Toxic gases such as ammonia and methane were common. At this point, Earth's early atmosphere consisted entirely of these volcanic gases, and there was no free oxygen. In the primordial "soup" of the early seas, organic molecules concentrated, formed more complex molecules, and became simple cells.

The transition from complex organic molecules to living cells could have occurred in several environments. Small, warm ponds are one possibility, but recent work has suggested that deep-sea hydrothermal/ents, such as those found along mid-ocean spreading centers today, may have been the cradle of Earth's life. These environments contain the chemicals and the source of energy needed to synthesize more complex organic structures. Although scientists have not succeeded in creating life from organic molecules in the laboratory, they have reproduced many of the intermediate steps.

So what were the first living things and when did they appear? Studies of genetic material indicate that a living group of single-celled organisms called Archaea may share many features with early life on Earth. Many Archaea now live in hot springs, deep-sea vents, saline water, and other harsh environments. If the first organisms resembled modern Archaea,

they also may have lived in such places, but direct evidence for early life is controversial because it is difficult to
distinguish between complex inorganic structures and simple biological ones in the geologic record. The oldest evidence
for life may be 3.5-billion-year-old sedimentary structures from Australia that resemble <u>stromatolites</u> . <u>Stromatolites</u> are
created today by living mats of microorganisms (mostly cyanobacteria, or blue-green algae). These primitive organisms
trap thin layers of sediment with their sticky filaments and grow upward to get light for photosynthesis

Global risks seem to abound right now. At the top of the list for finance people worlwide is "Brexit," the term for the Britain's vote on leaving the European Union. Even a highly ranked News Corp. executive is saying Britain should "set itself free from dictatorial Brussels." The interesting thing about Brexit is the vote results on May 23 may not even matter. Sovereign 10-year bond yields in Europe have already plummeted (Germany's is negative); the CBOE Volatility Index is up near 20, the danger mark; and crude oil prices are dipping below \$50 per barrel again.

CFOs, meanwhile, appear to be shifting a bit in their office chairs. Only 45% of them surveyed by EY recently think the global economy is stabilizing, and only 49% expect the global M&A market to improve over the next 12 months. *CFO's* own numbers show that nearly eight in ten (79%) U.S. executives believe that the United States economy faces moderate-to-large political risk. But it's not Brexit U.S. CFOs are worried about: it's the upcoming presidential election and Washington's "gridlock or dysfunction." Fifty-five percent of CFOs said the political climate has made them more cautious to spend. Subject: Brexit and the Presidential Election: CFO's Global Risk Management Newsletter

Global risks seem to abound right now. At the top of the list for finance people worlwide is "Brexit," the term for the Britain's vote on leaving the European Union. Even a highly ranked News Corp. executive is saying Britain should "set itself free from dictatorial Brussels." The interesting thing about Brexit is the vote results on May 23 may not even matter. Sovereign 10-year bond yields in Europe have already plummeted (Germany's is negative); the CBOE Volatility Index is up near 20, the danger mark; and crude oil prices are dipping below \$50 per barrel again.

CFOs, meanwhile, appear to be shifting a bit in their office chairs. Only 45% of them surveyed by EY recently think the global economy is stabilizing, and only 49% expect the global M&A market to improve over the next 12 months. *CFO's* own numbers show that nearly eight in ten (79%) U.S. executives believe that the United States economy faces moderate-to-large political risk. But it's not Brexit U.S. CFOs are worried about: it's the upcoming presidential election and Washington's "gridlock or dysfunction." Fifty-five percent of CFOs said the political climate has made them more cautious to spend. 

Subject: UPDATE: The Leadership of the California Infrastructure Bank Moves the National

Needle

An update on a topic I haven't sent around a note on in a while . . . - be in touch if want to know more as advise in this area right now -

The California Infrastructure Bank (I-Bank) recently issued a \$400 million plus Green Bond. The proceeds are going to much needed water projects in the state. Given the dire situation caused by the drought, money is being deployed swiftly.

Another Green Bond issuance, perhaps more, is in the works. Green Bonds are increasingly used by governments and companies to invest in forward-looking energy projects. Apple recently issued a \$1.5 billion dollar one.

The I-Bank is the only multi-sector infrastructure bank in the country and has lent out well north of \$37 billion to-date. It was created by Republican Governor Pete Wilson and is now moving aggressively into Clean Energy under Governor Jerry Brown right now.

I co-chaired the Governor Edmund Brown Jr. Task Force to Modernize the California Infrastructure Bank. After an extensive period of analyzing its lending practices to-date and its statute, as well as conducting broad outreach to key stakeholders including a roadshow to leading Northeastern investors, we made a number of recommendations.

These recommendations have largely been take up. They included:

- 1) Moving the I-Bank from the Treasurer's Office to the Governor's Office so that it could be intimately linked into the Office and its priorities
- 2) Giving it a mandate to carry out Green Infrastructure
- 3) Using its powers to catalyze large scale private investment in public infrastructure
- 4) Increasing its senior level staff so that it had the expertise and breadth of capabilities to carry out a broader intensive set of responsibilities

These recommendations were adopted by the Governor with the first one actually making its way through an unruly deeply divided CA legislature.

The leadership of the I-Bank is doing important innovative leading things right now within the Clean Endrgy and public-private partnership space right now. Nationally important innovative leading.

The issuance of the Green Bond is only the first part of planned program of clean energy infrastructure projects.

The I-Bank established what is called the California Lending for Energy and Environmental Needs Center, what it refers to for short as the CLEEN Center.

The CLEEN Center has broad powers to make clean energy projects happen including through the issuance of Green Bonds, use of loans, loan guarantees, and public-private partnerships catalyzed through credits, insurance and other enhancements.

In a time in which federal support for clean projects is in jeopardy, being rolled back in places or simply not up to the task of funding much needed projects, the I-Bank now has a directive to finance a range of project types including:

- 1. Renewable Energy
- 2. Storage Technology
- 3. Water
- 4. Alternative Technologies
- 5. Hydrogen Production
- 6. Alternative Fuels
- 7. Transportation
- 8. Energy Efficiency
- 9. Industrial Process Efficiency
- 10. Residential

In the current presidential cycle both the Secretary of State and Mr. Trump have made infrastructure investments a cornerstone of their respective economic platforms.

Recently, we at 32 Advisors held an event, hosted by Shearman & Sterling, on the election and infrastructure investments.

We had a lively discussion about how these commitments might make their way in practice. Happy to share what came out at the event. What is happening in California with the I-Bank warrants a careful review by each of the candidates; it will be of great interest in CA and beyond.



Chamber Present as Governor Signs Homeless Aid Bill

On the morning of April 10th, Florida Governor, Rick Scott, was in Orlando for a ceremonial bill signing of <u>SB 1534</u>. Orlando Shootings, Radical Jihadism and the Terrorism Terminology Battles

The <u>terrorism terminology battle</u> that has simmered for years and most recently flared between <u>Donald</u>

<u>Trump</u> on one side and <u>Hillary Clinton</u> and <u>Barack Obama</u> on the other boils down to this: Is there value or utility in linking and identifying as Islamic (radical or extremist) the spate of terror attacks carried out by those

who identify with Islamic State or other jihadi causes? No one argues for anything that would make more difficult the fight against those extremists who draw on Islamic texts and practices, however perversely, to validate their killing. A distinction is whether word choice or actions would alienate Muslim constituencies here and abroad that many–including me–would argue are vital to that fight.

President Obama, Mr. Trump, and Mrs. Clinton have made multiple statements and speeches since New Yorkborn Omar Mateen <u>killed 49 people and injured more than 50 others in Orlando</u>. Mr. Trump denounced the shootings as "radical Islamic terrorism" and charged that the president is not only weak on such issues but also that failing to identify the problem makes eliminating it impossible. President Obama has said that "<u>If we fall</u> into the trap of painting all Muslims with a broad brush and imply that we are at war with an entire religion, then we are doing the terrorists' work for them."

Mrs. Clinton, under pressure, has said both that "I'm not going to demonize and demagogue and declare war on an entire religion. That's just plain dangerous and it plays into ISIS's hands." as well as that "Radical jihadism, radical Islamism, I think they mean the same thing. I'm happy to say either."

The Obama administration is in many ways following the George W. Bush administration's lead. After Sept. 11, 2001, President Bush avoided declaring war on Islam or the Muslim world. During a visit to the Islamic Center in Washington less than a week after 9/11, Mr. Bush said: "The face of terror is not the true faith of Islam. That's not what Islam is all about. Islam is peace." Just days later, Mr. Bush's use of the loaded word "crusade"—"This crusade, this war on terrorism, is going to take a while."— sparked controversy, but by and large his administration described terrorism as acts of evil, which avoided fostering the idea that the U.S. was at war with Islam and sought to minimize the backlash against Muslims in the U.S. A "war on terror" was deemed more appropriate.

The Obama White House dubbed its summit on counterterrorism a meeting to counter violent extremism, itself steering clear of specific labels to help strengthen relations with Muslims in the U.S. and to avoid offending Muslims abroad who are allies in the fight against terrorism.

Mr. Trump's references to banning Muslims and accusing Muslims in the U.S. of supporting terrorists strike many–including me—as bigoted, xenophobic, and Islamophobic. At the same time, the Obama administration's apparent reluctance to consistently associate such attacks with jihadi extremism angers many. There is no point in denying connections between acts of terrorism and Islamist extremists. Of the five terror groups responsible for the most attacks worldwide, three promote an extreme Islamist ideology, according to the State

Department's 2015 counterterrorism report. The Orlando shooter's 9-1-1 calls, reports of what he said in the Pulse nightclub, and his previous associations with jihadi rhetoric suggest that he was inspired to some extent by the ISIS narrative. Accurately describing the challenge presented by jihadi attacks helps to clarify the complex task ahead. This isn't a clash of civilizations, nor is the U.S. at war with 1.7 billion Muslims or a religion in which a tiny fraction who adhere to extremist strains kill and inspire others to do so. Still, no other major religion is linked to such a phenomenon. Jihadi terror isn't an existential threat to the United States. But it is capable of inflicting tremendous suffering, and inadvertently minimizing this kind of terrorism doesn't help.

In our polarized political climate, consensus on language or a unifying message isn't forthcoming, particularly not in a presidential-election year. Still, nearly 15 years after 9/11 inflicted a tragic unifying moment, more ought to be possible in terms of accurately describing these adversaries and, more important, what to do about them.





First, my thoughts and prayers go out to the victims of the Pulse nightclub shooting and their families, and to you and your constituents. These types of events not only affect the victims and their immediate families, but society at large: they remind us of our vulnerability and the senselessness of mass violence.

Me and two other researchers have developed a predictive analytics strategy that we think could substantially assist law enforcement in getting early warning for a potential mass shooting. This strategy proposes tracking ammunition purchases in a secure, centralized database. The purchases are anonymized to protect identity, but with the ability to get a purchasers' ID after due process.

The ammunition purchase database will allow law enforcement to leverage powerful big data technology and predictive analytics to identify unusual ammunition purchase patterns that are indicative of an impending mass shooting. In addition, the system can learn over time by training it with actual shooting events and the ammunition purchase behavior that preceded it.

I have attached a more detailed description if you would like to know more. Of course, I and my fellow researchers are available to you as well, should you wish to discuss further.



Refugees come to the United States from some of the most hard-hit corners all around the world, having experienced hardships that the rest of us can barely imagine. Refugees are admitted to the United States for seeking a safe haven from a well-founded fear of persecution in their home countries, but they arrive to contribute to the American economy in a myriad of ways: bringing vitality to areas with declining populations, contributing to the growth of areas that are already flourishing, and expanding the labor force.

This <u>report</u> focuses on how four groups—Somali, Burmese, Hmong, and Bosnian refugees— are doing on key indicators of integration, such as wages, labor market participation, business ownership, English language ability, and citizenship in the United States. As the United States and other countries wrestle with how to handle the sharp rise in the number of people around the globe displaced by conflict and persecution, the long-term experience of the four groups studied in this report should provide some grounds for encouragement.





On Thursday, Lynx unveiled a new bus wrap to commemorate the victims of the Pulse nightclub mass shooting in Orlando.

"We touch just about every aspect of this community, and we needed to show our support," said Lynx CEO Edward Johnson. "We wanted to come up with a way to show that we stand as part of the OneOrlando mindset."

The bus features Orlando's Lake Eola fountain surrounded by a heart, a pulse and 49 doves representing the 49 victims of the tragedy.

"We tried to think of a way not only to honor the victims, but also to bring Orlando together," said lead creative designer Jessica Casa. "It seemed like the perfect thing to have [the fountain] in the heart and have a pulse entering it — the pulse of the city of Orlando."

The bus wrap was produced rapidly. Once the design team began, it was only a matter of hours until they put the finishing touches on the final product. After that, the installation company stepped in. Although the print and installation process typically takes three to four days, employees worked through the night to get the bus ready as quickly as possible.

"We're all very proud of the final product," Johnson said.

Although the bus is not running any routes yet, Johnson hopes it will run along Orange Avenue as a tribute to where the shooting took place.

The bus will remain in the fleet for some time to come.

"We don't want to put any timetable on this because we know that this event is going to be with us for a while," said Johnson. "There are a lot of things we have to go through as far as the healing process."

The company's Boston-based advertising contractor, Direct Media USA, is donating a second commemorative bus due to arrive in the upcoming week.

"They understand OneOrlando [because] they understand Boston Strong," said Matthew Friedman, director of marketing communications for Lynx.

"My hope for this design is that it will help the community heal," Casa said. "It's a tough time, and we want people to know we're all in this together."

Lynx has also started an internal company website to collect money that will be donated to the OneOrlando fund.

"This was such a small token of what we could do to show our spirit as well as get the message out to our entire community: We are a unified Orlando," Johnson said.

"We enhance people's lives everyday through passion, pride, and performance."



Dear Elected Officials:

I know that I am just one small voice, but I also know if I feel this passionately about something that I should speak up. I was less than 10 miles away from the deadliest mass shooting in the history of the United States of America. I try to keep putting it out of my head, but when I go into my internship, I see those who were affected by this. When I go to school, I see those who were affected by this. I demand to know what is going to be done. I am scared. I am traumatized. I am upset. WHY IS NOTHING GETTING DONE?

I understand if people want to have handguns in their homes to protect their families. But do we need to make automatic weapons capable of killing many people in seconds available to the general population — so easy, in fact, that it only takes less than 10 minutes to buy one at a gun store?! The fact that buying an automatic weapon is as easy as buying a pack of cigarettes is crazy to me. Are we going to start selling bombs at CVS as well? Is this even real right now? Orlando, **FL** - The Salvation Army disaster response teams from the Orlando and Sanford corps continue to provide support to first responders and families at The Pulse nightclub, providing food, drinks, and emotional and spiritual care.

"Yesterday was a day of transition as we worked with the local, state, and federal teams to ensure the safety of the personnel on the ground," said Major Ted Morris, Salvation Army Orlando Area Commander. "With the heat index reaching into triple digits yesterday, people need to stay hydrated. Heat

exhaustion is a serious concern."

Providing food and drinks is a core service of The Salvation Army, and while food service will continue, the more critical need is hydration. In addition to its mobile canteens, The Salvation Army has also mobilized three Polaris utility task vehicles (UTVs) to more effectively distribute water and sports drinks to responder personnel throughout the secure area. With streets blocked off to traffic, the Polaris UTVs have allowed teams to get resources to responders more efficiently, ensuring the safety of more than three hundred local, state, and federal personnel.

Major Ted Morris and Mr. Kelvin Coachman, Salvation Army Director of Social Services, are also coordinating with other community organizations to support families at the City of Orlando 'one-stop' assistance center, located at Camping World stadium. The Salvation Army has positioned a second disaster response team at the stadium to provide hydration and snacks to family members seeking information and assistance.

"In the Central Florida community, we support needy families every day, and in the days to come, we need to focus on finding resources for all those coping with this tragedy," said Major Morris. "Comfort may come in the forms of either financial assistance or physical aid, like hydration and snacks, but we also know that many of these families need to know that we care deeply and we grieve with them in their loss."

It handicaps future reaction to change since first information forms deepest roots becoming most difficult to abandon. This proposal fights that using only proven facts.

Currently nations are scrambling for new alliances, strategies, actions, financing and resources for global war against ISIS and more broadly, Islamic terrorism. 

Out of Africa SCIENCE

Somewhere between 80,000 and 50,000 years ago, Africa saved *Homo sapiens* from extinction. Charting the DNA shared by more than <u>six billion people</u>, a population geneticist—and director of the Genographic Project—suggests what humanity "owes" its first home. Do you think you know who you are? Maybe Irish, Italian, Jewish, Chinese, or one of the dozens of other hyphenated Americans that make up the United States melting pot? Think deeper—beyond the past few hundred years. Back beyond genealogy, where everyone loses track of his or her ancestry—back in that dark, mysterious realm we call prehistory. What if I told you every single person in America—every single person on earth—is African? With a small scrape of cells from the inside of anyone's cheek, the science of genetics can even prove it.

Here's how it works. The human genome, the blueprint that describes how to make another version of you, is huge. It's composed of billions of sub-units called nucleotides, repeated in a long, linear code that contains all of your biological information. Skin color, hair type, the way you metabolize milk: it's all in there. You got your DNA from your parents, who got it from theirs, and so on, for millions of generations to the very beginning of life on earth. If you go far enough back, your genome connects you with bacteria, butterflies, and barracuda—the great chain of being linked together through DNA.

What about humanity, though? What about creatures you would recognize as being like you if they were peering over your shoulder right now? It turns out that every person alive today can trace his or her ancestry back to Africa. Everyone's DNA tells a story of a journey from an African homeland to wherever you live. You may be from Cambodia or County Cork but you are carrying a map inside your genome that describes the wanderings of your ancestors as they moved from the savannas of Africa to wherever your family came from most recently. This is thanks to genetic markers—tiny changes that arise rarely and spontaneously as our DNA is copied and passed down through the generations—which serve to unite people on ever older branches of the human family tree. If you share a marker with someone, you share an ancestor with him or her at some point in the past: the person who's DNA first had the marker that defines your shared lineage. These markers can be traced to relatively specific times and places as humans moved across the globe. The farther back in time and the closer to Africa we get, the more markers we all share.

What set these migrations in motion? Climate change—today's big threat—seems to have had a long history of tormenting our species. Around 70,000 years ago it was getting very nippy in the northern part of the globe, with ice sheets bearing down on Seattle and New York; this was the last Ice Age. At that time, though, our species, *Homo sapiens*, was still limited to Africa; we were very much homebodies. But the encroaching Ice Age, perhaps coupled with the eruption of a super-volcano named Toba, in Sumatra, dried out the tropics and nearly decimated the early human population. While *Homo sapiens* can be traced to around 200,000 years ago in the fossil record, it is remarkably difficult to find an archaeological record of our species between 80,000 and 50,000 years ago, and genetic data suggest that the

population eventually dwindled to as few as 2,000 individuals. Yes, 2,000—fewer than fit into many symphony halls. We were on the brink of extinction.

And then something happened. It began slowly, with only a few hints of the explosion to come: The first stirrings were art—tangible evidence of advanced, abstract thought—and a significant improvement in the types of tools humans made. Then, around 50,000 years ago, all hell broke loose. The human population began to expand, first in Africa, then leaving the homeland to spread into Eurasia. Within a couple of thousand years we had reached Australia, walking along the coast of South Asia. A slightly later wave of expansion into the Middle East, around 45,000 years ago, was aided by a brief damp period in the Sahara. Within 15,000 years of the exodus from Africa our species had entered Europe, defeating the Neanderthals in the process. (Neanderthals are distant cousins, not ancestors; our evolutionary lineages have been separate for more than 500,000 years.) We had also populated Asia, learning to live in frigid temperatures not unlike those on the Moon, and around 15,000 years ago we walked across a short-lived, icy land bridge to enter the Americas—the first hominids ever to set foot on the continents of the Western Hemisphere. Along the way we kept adapting to new climates, in some cases lost our dark tropical skin pigmentation, developed different languages, and generated the complex tapestry of human diversity we see around the world today, from Africa to Iceland to Tierra del Fuego. But the thing that set it all in motion, the thing that saved us from extinction, happened first in Africa.

Some anthropologists call it the Great Leap Forward, and it marked the true origin of our species—the time when we started to behave like humans.

Africa gave us the tool we needed, in the form of a powerful, abstract mind, to take on the world (and eventually to decode the markers in our DNA that make it possible to track our amazing journeys). Perhaps just a few small genetic mutations that appeared around 50,000 years ago gave humans the amazing minds we use to make sense of the confusing and challenging world around us. Using our incredible capacity to put abstract musing into practice, we have managed to populate every continent on earth, in the process increasing the size of our population from a paltry few thousand to more than six billion. Now, 50 millennia after that first spark, times have changed. A huge number of things have contributed to Africa's relative decline on the world stage, perhaps most important geography. As Jared Diamond describes in his masterly book *Guns, Germs, and Steel,* Eurasia, with its East-West axis, allowed the rapid latitudinal diffusion of ideas and tools that would give its populations a huge advantage after the initial leap out of Africa. Couple that with the results of colonial exploitation over the past five centuries, and Africa, despite many strengths and resources, is once again in need, as it was 70,000 years ago. This time, though, things are different.

The world population that was spawned in Africa now has the power to save it. We are all alive today because of what happened to a small group of hungry Africans around 50,000 years ago. As their good sons and daughters, those of us who left, whether long ago or more recently, surely have a moral imperative to use our gifts to support our cousins who stayed. It's the least we can do for the continent that saved us all thousands of years ago.

- 3:133: "Be quick in the race for forgiveness from your Lord, and for a Garden whose width is that (of the whole) of the heavens and of the earth, prepared for the righteous."
- 3:185: "Every soul shall have a taste of death: And only on the Day of Judgment shall you be paid your full recompense. Only he who is saved far from the Fire and admitted to the Garden will have attained the object (of Life): For the life of this world is but goods and chattels of deception."
- 18:107: "As to those who believe and work righteous deeds, they have, for their entertainment, the Gardens of Paradise."
- 39:73: "And those who feared their Lord will be led to the Garden in crowds: until behold, they arrive there; its gates will be opened; and its keepers will say: 'Peace be upon you! well have ye done! enter ye here, to dwell therein'."
- 39:74: "They will say: 'Praise be to God, Who has truly fulfilled His Promise to us, and has given us (this) land in heritage: We can dwell in the Garden as we will: how excellent a reward for those who work (righteousness)!' "
- 47:15: "(Here is) a Parable of the Garden which the righteous are promised: in it are rivers of water incorruptible; rivers of milk of which the taste never changes; rivers of wine, a joy to those who drink; and rivers of honey pure and clear. In it there are for them all kinds of fruits; and Grace from their Lord...."
- Sura 56:1-40 of the Qur'an deals in depth with the Day of Judgment and the rewards that await persons who have led a good life.

- •56:15-21: "[They will sit] on gold-encrusted thrones of happiness, reclining upon them, facing one another in [love]. Immortal youths will wait upon them with goblets, and ewers, and cups filled with water from unsullied springs by which their minds will not be clouded and which will not make them drunk; and with fruit of any kind that they choose, and with flesh of any fowl that they may desire."
- •56:22-26: "And [accompanying them will be their] companions pure, most beautiful of eye, like unto pearls hidden in their shells. [This will be] a reward for what they did [during life]. No empty talk will they hear there, nor any call to sin, but only the tiding of inner soundness and peace."
- •56:27-33: "Now as for those who have attained to righteousness- what of those who have attained to righteousness? [They too will find themselves] amidst fruit-laden lote-trees, and acacias flower-clad, and shade extended, and waters gushing, and fruit abounding, never-failing and never out of reach."
- •56:34-37: "And [with them will be their] spouses, raised high; for behold, We shall have brought them into being in a life renewed, having resurrected them as virgins, full of love, well matched to those who have attained to righteousness"
- Surah 55 discusses the presence of "húr." They have most commonly been considered to be Houris -- beautiful virgins:
 - **55:70:** "In them will be fair [Maidens], good, beautiful."
 - •55:72: "Maidens restrained [as to their glances], in [goodly] pavilions."
 - 55:74: "Whom no man or Jinn before them has touched."

Janna (Paradise, Heaven) is called by eight names in the Qur'an: Jannatu al-Khuld, Darul as-Salam, Darul al-Qarar, Jannatu al-`Adn, Jannatu al-Ma`wa, Jannatu an-Na`im, `Illiyin, and Jannatu al-Firdaus. *Janna* is the Arabic word for "garden." 1 They have been translated into English as: paradise, a garden on high, a home that will last, garden of eternity, garden of everlasting bliss, gardens of delight, home of peace, home of the righteous, etc. 2

The Prophet Muhammad is quoted as saying that everyone will see God on the Day of Resurrection, as easily as one can see the sun when there are no clouds. 3

There will be no sickness, pain, sadness or death there. The Prophet Muhammad said that there are things in Paradise "which no eye has seen no ear has heard and no human mind has thought of." 4

Surah 44:51-55 and 52:17-20 state that the men in Paradise will enter marriage with the Houris.

<u>Jinns</u> are living entities that God created from "a smokeless flame of fire." ₅ They are invisible to the human eye but marry, produce children, eat, drink, and die like all other creatures in the universe." _{7,8}

In his commentary on Surah 55:72, Ibn Kathir (d. 1373 CE) stated: "The Prophet Muhammad was heard saying: 'The smallest reward for the people of paradise is an abode where there are 80,000 servants and 72 wives, over which stands a dome decorated with pearls, aquamarine, and ruby, as wide as the distance from Al-Jabiyyah [a Damascus suburb] to Sana'a [Yemen]'." 9

Who is eligible for entry into Paradise:

Entry to Paradise is limited to those who believe in God and his messengers, and who have led a good life on earth. In the Qur'an:

- **Surah 2:25:** "And give good news [O Muhammad] to those who believe and do good deeds, that they will have gardens [Paradise] in which rivers flow...."
- **Surah 4:57:** "But those who believe and do good deeds, We will admit them to gardens (Paradise) in which rivers flow, lasting in them forever...."
- **Surah 57:21:** "Race one with another for forgiveness from your Lord and for Paradise, whose width is as the width of the heavens and the earth, which has been prepared for those who believe in God and His messengers...."

Presumably Agnostics, Atheists, Polytheists, and followers of non-<u>Abrahamic religions</u> will be denied access to Paradise because they lack belief. NOW-- BACK TO SAVING OUR EARTH FROM DESTRUCTION.

Various studies to estimate the number of galaxies in the universe vary from 200 to 800 billion. The vastness of space is best appreciated when distance out there is described in light years.



WELCOME TO OUR GALAXY THE MILKY WAY AND TEENY PLANET EARTH—ALONE IN THE







The First Life on Earth

Earth was able to support life only after the planet had cooled enough for a rocky crust to solidify. Once that happened, water vapor from volcanoes condensed in the atmosphere, fell as rain, and collected on the Earth's surface. Besides water vapor, volcanoes also produced gases rich in the basic ingredients of life: carbon, hydrogen, oxygen, and nitrogen. Toxic gases such as ammonia and methane were common. At this point, Earth's early atmosphere consisted entirely of these volcanic gases, and there was no free oxygen. In the primordial "soup" of the early seas, organic molecules concentrated, formed more complex molecules, and became simple cells.

The transition from complex organic molecules to living cells could have occurred in several environments. Small, warm ponds are one possibility, but recent work has suggested that deep-sea hydrothermal/ents, such as those found along mid-ocean spreading centers today, may have been the cradle of Earth's life. These environments contain the chemicals and the source of energy needed to synthesize more complex organic structures. Although scientists have not succeeded in creating life from organic molecules in the laboratory, they have reproduced many of the intermediate steps.

So what were the first living things and when did they appear? Studies of genetic material indicate that a living group of single-celled organisms called Archaea may share many features with early life on Earth. Many Archaea now live in hot springs, deep-sea vents, saline water, and other harsh environments. If the first organisms resembled modern Archaea,

they also may have lived in such places, but direct evidence for early life is controversial because it is difficult to
distinguish between complex inorganic structures and simple biological ones in the geologic record. The oldest evidence
for life may be 3.5-billion-year-old sedimentary structures from Australia that resemble <u>stromatolites</u> . <u>Stromatolites</u> are
created today by living mats of microorganisms (mostly cyanobacteria, or blue-green algae). These primitive organisms
trap thin layers of sediment with their sticky filaments and grow upward to get light for photosynthesis

Tools and Resources to Help Businesses Plan, Prepare, and Protect from an Attack

Homeland Security Starts with Hometown Security

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) closely monitors attacks on public gatherings and public places to constantly enhance the Nation's security. During both steady state and times of heightened awareness, DHS engages closely with our private sector and community partners to provide expert counsel and recommendations about protective measures they can implement to protect facilities and venues. DHS provides free tools and resources to communities because the Department recognizes that communities are the first line of defense in keeping the public safe and secure.

The Department encourages businesses to Connect, Plan, Train, and Report. Applying these four steps in advance of an incident or attack can help better prepare businesses and their employees to proactively think about the role they play in the safety and security of their businesses and communities.

CONNECT: Reach out and develop relationships in your community, including local law enforcement. Having these relationships established before an incident occurs can help speed up the response when something happens.

- Develop relationships with local law enforcement and businesses in your area. Invite local law enforcement to tour your business.
- Connect with community security and preparedness organizations such as the Federal Bureau of Investigation's public-private partnership program "InfraGard."
- Contact the local DHS Protective Security Advisor who is available to support your efforts.
- Communicate with your customers and let them know about the security measures you are taking to ensure a positive experience and to maintain public safety.
- If your business is located at or near a Federal facility, connect with DHS's Federal Protective Service at 1-877-4FPS-411.

PLAN: Take the time now to plan on how you will handle a security event should one occur. Learn from other events to inform your plans.

- Be aware of current threats related to your geographic region or impacting your business sector.
- Develop plans, including security, emergency response, emergency communications, and business continuity plans, while considering the protection of your employees and customers, access control, closed-circuit television, signage, suspicious activity reporting, and parking security.
- Evaluate your security requirements and design a monitoring, surveillance, and inspection program that is consistent with your business operations.
- Develop evacuation and shelter-in-place plans, and ensure that multiple evacuation routes are clearly marked with appropriate signage and that rallying points are available.
- Develop and implement a security plan for computer and information systems hardware and software.

• Engage local first responders (police, fire, medical) in all of the above efforts to ensure your efforts are in synergy with theirs.

TRAIN: Provide your employees with training resources and exercise your plans often. The best laid plans must be exercised in order to be effective.

- Train employees on identifying and reporting suspicious activities, active shooter scenarios, and what to do if they suspect an improvised explosive device (IED). Ensure they understand security basics, emergency response, business continuity plans, and increased awareness of potential threats.
- Exercise your emergency communications plan.

REPORT: "If You See Something, Say SomethingTM" is more than just a slogan. Call local law enforcement.

- Post details on reporting suspicious activity and encourage employees, tenants, and visitors to report
 suspicious behavior to property management security or local law enforcement. Things to consider
 include unattended vehicles; repeat visitors or outsiders who have no apparent business in non-public
 area; abandoned parcels, suitcases, backpacks, and packages; and other unusual activity.
- Get involved with the Department's "If You See Something, Say SomethingTM" campaign.

The Sea-to-Sea Flag has become a globally-recognized symbol of the LGBTQ movement and symbolizes acceptance, understanding, education, solidarity, and inclusion.

WHAT: The original rainbow flag was designed by San Francisco artist Gilbert Baker in 1978

as a symbol of gay and lesbian pride in response to anti-gay activities. In the spring of 2003, Baker and a team of volunteers cut and sewed a 1.25-mile-long version of the flag in Key West, to celebrate the iconic banner's 25th anniversary. On June 15, 2003, some 2,000 volunteers unfurled the flag from the Atlantic Ocean to the Gulf of Mexico along the entire length of Duval Street, in a sea-to-sea representation of

pride and diversity. Section 93 has since traveled worldwide.
